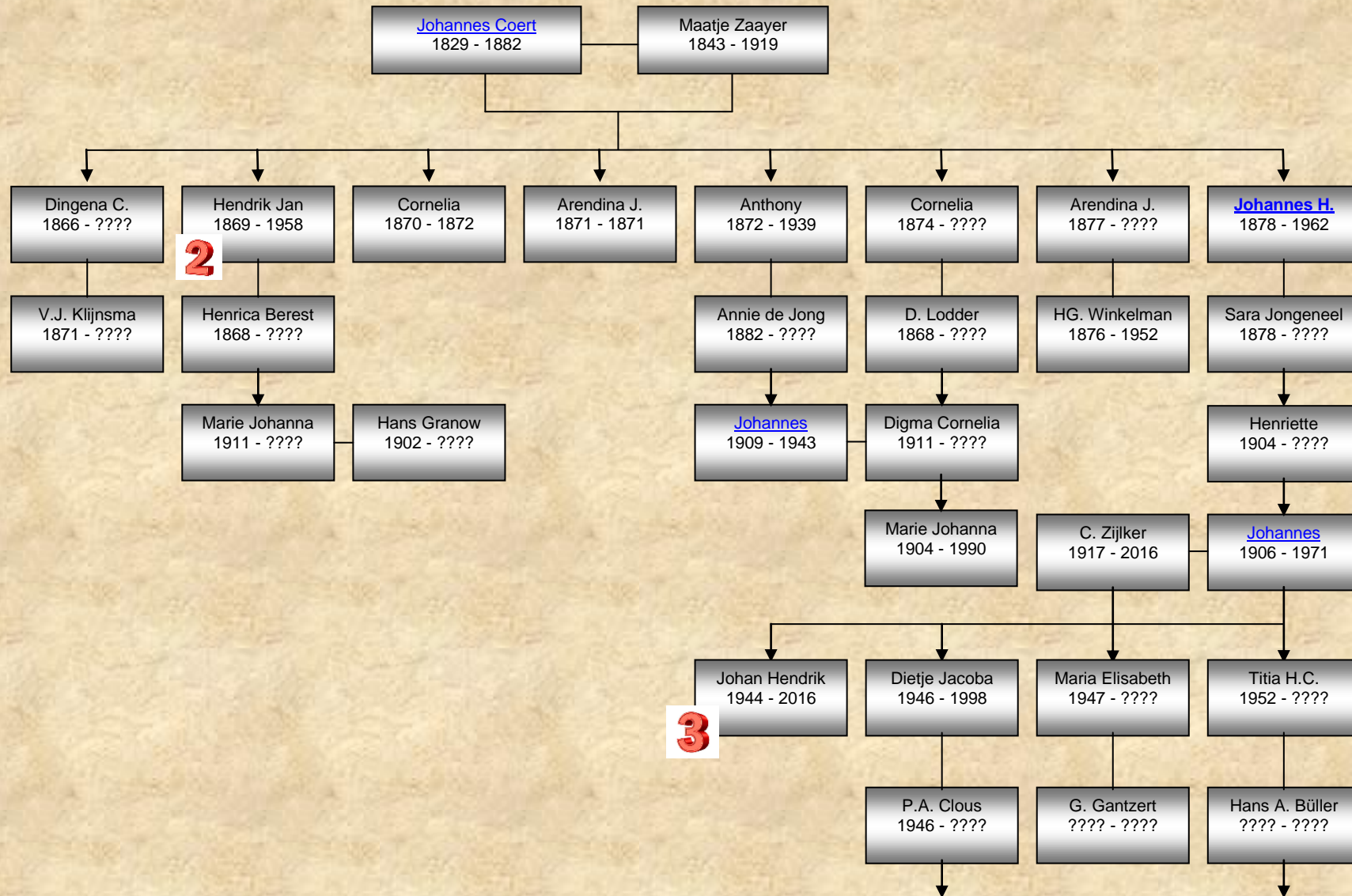


Coert Family Tree (Last modified: 01 April 2017)

Johannes Coert [1829 – 1882]

Johannes Coert was born in Hendrik Ido Ambacht on the 10th of August 1829, and died in Goedereede on the 3rd of February 1882, where he was established as a notary and since 1866 and for many years he was a member of the City Council. On the 16th of May 1867 in Nieuwe Tonge he married Maatje Zaaijer. She was born in Nieuwe Tonge on the 20th of December 1843, and died in The Hague on the 12th of February 1919. She was the daughter of Anthony Zaaijer and Dingena Vreeswijk. They had 8 children. Dingena Cornelia, Hendrik Jan (he was the second in line who worked on the “Geschiedenis van de Familie Coert”); On the 20th of June 1898 he was promoted to doctor in Leiden; he married Henrica Berest; she was born in Soerabaja), Cornelia, Arendina Jacomina, Anthony (a Painter and Assistant Director of the Stedelijk museum “de Lakenhal” in Leiden; he died 19th of February 1939), Cornelia, Arendina Jacomina (she was married to Henri Gerard Winkelman; Commander-in-Chief land and naval forces; He was General from 1st November 1939 and at the time of the German invasion in 1940) and Johannes.

Johannes H. Coert [1878 – 1962]

Mr. Johannes H. Coert was born in Goedereede on the 16th of June 1878 and died in Rotterdam on the 17th of December 1962. On the 28th of November 1900 he became a **Doctor in “Science of the law”** in Leiden. In 1901 he moved to Rotterdam. In September 1903 he became an **Advocate and a Public Prosecutor**. On the 16th of July 1903 in Leiden he married Sara Maria Catalijna Jongeneel, born on the 31st of May 1878. She was the daughter of Ds. Jacob Jongeneel and Maria Henriette Koopman. Together with Mr. Johannes Coert [1906-1971] he helped the Thyssen family (of the Thyssenbank) to get their capital back from the Russians, who were at that moment just after the war as allied forces ruling the east part of Germany. Part of these valuables belonged to the Queen of The Netherlands. Since it was in fact illegal to do so because the Russians were not willing to give it back it came out many years later. This story was published in the Dutch newspaper NRC.

Johannes Coert [1906 – 1971]

Johannes was born in Rotterdam (The Netherlands) on the 2nd of April 1906 and died in Hierden the 22nd August 1971. On the 29th of March 1943 he married in Rotterdam Catherina Cornelia Zijlker. She was born in The Hague on the 1st of January 1917 and died in November 2016. They had 4 children: Johan Hendrik (Master of Laws; the third in line who worked on the “Geschiedenis van de Familie Coert”), Diëtje Jacoba, “Sarah” Maria Elisabeth (she lives in France) and Titia Henriette Cornelia (Master of Laws

and a Sister). Johannes was a cavalier and liaison officer in the Dutch army just after the 2nd World War in occupied Germany. By order of Prins Bernard he must take the capital of the Dutch Royal House out of the Russian zone.

Johannes Coert [1909 – 1943]

He was born in Gorssel (The Netherlands) on the 25th of November 1909. On the 8th of March 1937 he married Digma Cornelia Lodder. She was born in Rotterdam on the 12th of February 1911. Digma was the daughter of Mr Dimmen Lodder and Cornelia Coert. Johannes and Digma were full nephew and niece. They had no children. Johannes was a serving Officer in the **French foreign legion**. Johannes hold the rank of Sous Lieutenant and died in Tunisia (during or after a big German attack of the dessert Army of Field-Marshal Rommel) on the 22nd of January 1943. His name is written on the Honor wall of the Legion.
